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Financial Report—Larry, Treasurer

Cash on hand of \$17k against accounts payable and prepaid member fees of \$38k. Leaving a deficit balance of \$21k with hopes that some of that will be made up in December if the weather cooperates.

Reserve Member Fees are tracking to budget with no major delinquency, but a couple of co-owners are slightly behind, but not yet requiring hard collection measures.

Operating Expenses: Lawn & Grounds Maintenance for 2023 will be very close to budget. Fall cleanup should be adequate for year end December work. Sprinklers and aerators combined will be \$6k over budget. Not a good year. Building Maint and Other Contractors goes into December with \$36k remaining. We were hoping this

was going to give us the extra funds for the overspend in reserve window repair. Structural, roof, drywall, garage door will offset each other as long as December does not slip us a surprise. Winter Expense has a remaining balance of \$36k, should be enough. Combined utilities will be a wash. The 10k over on consulting (legal) and insurance are lost \$'s. All other variances are small \$'s. The Reserve Account was fully funded for 2023 plus \$80k of what we were hoping would be underspending in Operating Expenses when the final 2023 numbers are in there will be a portion of that, that will have to be returned to the Operating funds. Reserve Spending: We did catch up on the initial fees in Oct/Nov expenditures for the mailbox project stand at \$78,584. There has been little activity in the window replacement expenditures in Oct and Nov. We expect to have some December installs that will be reflected in the year end numbers.

Portage Water Bill—If you are 65 years or older, you can go to the City of Portage and fill out a form (Senior Citizen Water Billing Discount Application). You will receive a 10% discount on your water bill. You can also locate this form on their website to print and fill out.

Locking Mailbox Parcel Locker Instructions

If you received a package too big for your mail slot, the postal worker will place a key in your mail slot. Place the key in the lock, turn to open. Once this is done the key will not come out. Remove your package and close the door. The postal worker is the only one that will be able to remove the key. If all the parcel lockers are full, your package will be placed at your front door.

New Payment Books—New payment books were put in the mail to you on December 5th. Please watch for these to arrive. Also, if you have any automatic payments set up please make sure to adjust that amount when you receive your new payment book.
